Things I would like to Remember From Today's Message

MONDAY

JULY 9TH 2012 MARK 16:14-20

The ESV Study bible makes it clear that in v. 18 there is not a command to pick up serpents or to drink deadly posion. This is only a promise of God's protection as found in other parts of the new testament.

- We see that Jesus is clear about proclamation of the Gospel. Yet he does not want us only to proclaim, but to baptize. Why is important to continue the disciple process after someone has accepted Christ?
- Once we have accepted Christ why is it important for us to continue in the discipleship process ourselves? What are some ways we can become better disciples?

TUESDAY

JULY 10TH 2012 LUKE 24:45-49

The Great Commision is captured in all the Gospels but in slightly different ways. The difference is nothing we should be ashamed of. If we where to all write notes from the same sermon the notes would look different but contain the same message.

- Here we see the emphasis is on the repentance and forgiveness of sins. Why is forgiveness important in sharing Christ with others? Why is forgiveness important in all of our lives?
- "to all nations" is a concept we see a lot in the great commission. Think for a moment of nations as a "people group." What is an unreached group of people in Evans County?

WEDNESDAY

JULY 11TH 2012 JOHN 20:21-22

Jesus starts this commision as saying "Peace be with you." As we are being sent out into a hurting and dark world, we can easily become afriad.

- Christ reassures us by saying just as God has sent Him, He is sending us. I take comfort in knowing that God is preparing things in my day before me.
- Being sent is a pretty important idea. Having purpose for our life is huge! What are some specific things God has called or sent you to do? What is keeping you from fulfilling them?

THURSDAY

JULY 12TH 2012 ACTS 1:6-9

This is one of the more famous Great Commissions that you may be familiar with. In v. 6 the disciples ask when the kingdom of Israel would be restored. The disciples are still hoping for a military overthrow of the Romans. Yet this does not happen.

- How does God's kingdom look different than a worldly kingdom?
- Jesus says, "you will receive power." What type of power do you think he meant?
- "to the end of the earth" is how far Jesus' message should go. How can we continue to help reach people for Christ? How can we support global missions?
